Ranking method

- ▷ Ranking is open to all cyclist, regardless of level.
 - ▷ It is necessary to complete at least 1 event within the world tour to be able to be considered in the final ranking.
 - ▷ Participants must complete a minimum of 3 world tour events in order to be considered in the final awards.
 - ▷ In the final ranking, only the 3 best results from the individual will be taken into consideration.
-
- ▷ Rankings for both men & woman will be applied under the same rules.
 - ▷ Category rankings will be given, but only overall men & woman rankings will be awarded.
 - ▷ Categories will follow the UCI master category system

Race points

01

Each finishing participant is awarded points according to the following formula:

GFWT (event) race winner time / racer time *1000

GFWT (long event) race winner time / racer time *1000

**GFWT (Short event) race winner time / racer time *600
(short event)**

In the cast of equal points, see next slide

Race points

In the case of equal points:

- 1** The participant with the higher rank will be that who has participated in the most number of GFWT events.
- 2** In the case of an equal number of events, the participant with the higher rank is that who participated in the last GFWT event of the year.
- 3** In the case of participants still having an equal amount of points, each will be declared a winner and will share the position(s) and split the pooled prize money from the positions in question.

Race points to final ranking

$$\text{Final Ranking Points} = \sum \left(\frac{t_{\text{event A winner}}}{t_{\text{event A}}} \times 1000 + \frac{t_{\text{event B winner}}}{t_{\text{event B}}} \times 1000 \right)$$

t = time in hours and decimals (hh,mmm)

A,B,C : 3 best results (in points not by event ranking)

In case that only have 2 results there is no C results only A and B

The World Tour / Final Prize



The top 3 overall winners in the open category will be announced through media and will receive a prize.

- ▶ A minimum of 1 event must be completed by participants so as to be ranked in the final world tour ranking.
- ▶ A minimum of 3 events must be completed by participants in order to receive the global final prize. Participants with less than 3 events will be ranked but are ineligible to receive a prize.
