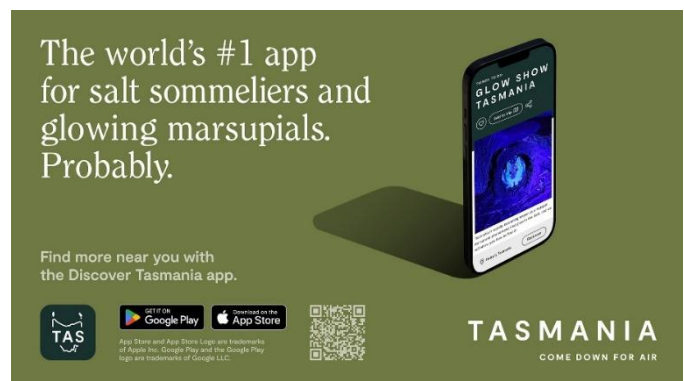

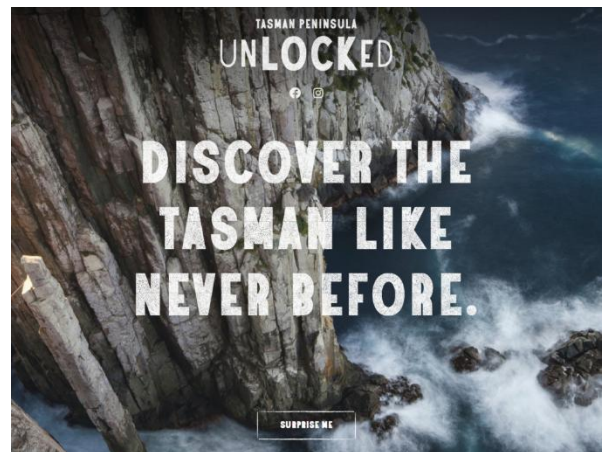


Tasman Peninsula
